

Description:

This lithographed full-length portrait of Abraham Lincoln, by or after John Chester Buttre, presents the 16th President of the United States in a poised and contemplative stance, with his left hand on his hip and right hand resting on a table adorned with books, an oil lamp, and a significant document on constitutional freedom. Rendered in a room reflecting the classical style, complete with a large column, drapery, a rococo chair, and a Persian carpet, this image is imbued with symbolism and artistry. Lincoln's hand's proximity to a document reading "FREEDOM" potentially alludes to the Emancipation Proclamation, dating the print to circa 1863.

Amidst the Civil War, President Lincoln's leadership faced immense challenges, including the contentious issue of slavery. The Emancipation Proclamation, issued on January 1, 1863, was a seminal moment in the conflict, declaring that all enslaved persons in Confederate-held territory were to be set free. This legal and symbolic act became a turning point in the struggle for civil rights and the abolition of slavery in America.
